ORIGINAL AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SUNNYSIDE, WASHINGTON, AMENDING 2016 **BUDGET (ORDINANCE 2015-21) AS A RESULT OF UNANTICIPATED TRANSFERS AND EXPENDITURES** OF VARIOUS FUNDS, AND FIXING A TIME WHEN THE SAME SHALL BE EFFECTIVE (2016 Budget Amendment No. 2)

WHEREAS, the City Council has previously adopted Ordinance 2015-21 approving the 2016 Budget; and

WHEREAS, staff has recommended amendment of such budget to account for unanticipated transfers and expenditures of various funds; and

WHEREAS, the application of funds have been identified and the City Council of the City of Sunnyside finds and determines that such amendment of the 2016 Budget is in the best interests of residents of the City of Sunnyside and will promote the general health, safety and welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SUNNYSIDE, WASHINGTON, as follows:

Section 1 of Ordinance 2015-21 adopting the budget for the fiscal year 2016 is hereby amended to incorporate the changes shown in Exhibit "A", attached hereto and adopted herein by reference.

Section 2. Except as amended herein, Ordinance 2015-21 as previously amended heretofore shall remain unchanged.

This Ordinance, being an exercise of a power specifically Section 3. delegated to the City legislative body, is not subject to referendum, and shall be effective five days after passage, approval and publication as required by law.
